Something strange is happening this weekend. It's a Bank Holiday and the weather forecast is good, in fact better than good, it's supposed to be excellent, so stop reading this and go flying, read this later.

This is the last Newsletter before the first Club BBQ of the year so here is a reminder.

Although it may have changed by the time you read this, the grass at the Field is currently a bit long because the recent rain has both caused it to grow faster and made it difficult to cut. A runway has been cut in the middle which may get expanded if we can get enough mowers together.

Anyway, it's good practise for precision landings and cross-wind take-offs, or models with big wheels that can fly from long grass. It was suggested at the meeting that we could get someone local to go over the field with a 'topper', a big rotary mower that will cut long grass (I didn't know what a 'topper' was before, now I do) for about £30. This would bring the height down and allow our mower to cut it again. There was also the suggestion that the Club could get it's own topper, if we could find one at a suitable price.

I can't really call this a Spotlight Model but I'll put it here anyway because I bought it recently and it's great fun for the money (about £53 delivered to my door). It's an Eachine E013, a 65mm class quad (distance between motors in opposite corners) with shrouded motors and a 4 minute or so flight time. It comes with a toy type transmitter (you need to supply 3 AAA batteries for this) and mono screen goggles yes, this is a complete First Person View system.

> Charging leads are supplied for the quad and the goggles. The goggles aren't great, I needed to add a credit card sized fresnal lens as I need reading glasses, but they are easy to use and have a 40 channel receiver. The quad is small enough

to bounce off things and I have been flying it around my house, including up and down the stairs, and around the rotary washing line in my garden so it can't be hard to fly.
