Last month I forgot to include in the list the models mentioned in the previous Newsletter. Hopefully you would have received an e-mail with the others, if not here's the complete list:

So far I have received 5 votes across 4 aircraft (I won't say which ones).

Some discussion at the meeting suggested that, as it's a big list and the model may take some time to build, the completion date should be moved to 2020 instead of 2019. Also a second round of voting could take place only including the models voted for this time. Thoughts and ideas to this Newsletter or at the next meeting please.

Some good news via the BMFA with regards to the 2018 amendment to the Air Navigation Order, which came into effect on 30 July 2018 and imposed a 400ft height limit for all unmanned aircraft. (Yes, some of the EASA regulations just became law, more to follow in November 2019).

A CAA Permission has been published to allow operation in excess of 400ft.

The conditions in addition to the normal ANO rules are:

Only members of BMFA, SAA, LMA or FPVUK.

Maximum weight of 7kg (excluding fuel).

No autonomous flight capability except stabilisation.

Does not apply to rotorcraft with more than one lift generating rotor or propeller.

Does not apply within flight restricted zones or protected aerodromes.

Line of sight flight only.

A CAA Exemption has been published to allow FPV operation in excess of 400ft.

The conditions in addition to the normal ANO rules for FPV flight are:

Only members of BMFA, SAA, LMA or FPVUK.

Maximum weight of 3.5kg (including fuel).

No autonomous flight capability except stabilisation.

Does not apply to rotorcraft with more than one lift generating rotor or propeller.

Maximum height of 1000ft.
