The Spotlight model this month is a result of me going to the last Buckminster Swapmeet. I wanted something that would handle a little weather and be 'bouncable' so I could practise some of the things I can't do, and be able to fix it easily later. I found an EPP foam Me109 from Hobbyking just needing a battery and receiver and, after some haggling, handed over £22 for it. At about 35"

span and pulling 16 amps with an 8x4 prop, it will knife edge better than me and is easy to launch underarm. I haven't tested out it's 'repairability' yet but I'm sure it will happen before long!



Sometimes it's one model in, one model out. While setting up my Century Swift's tail and gyro on my turntable/workbench, one side of the body broke away from the U/C causing the model to tilt with enough force to tip over the workbench. Jumping through the door and killing the motor prevented injury but the repair cost has put an end to the Swift. I did manage to fix my garden chair though.

Finally, we have a good pile of wood near our heater now, which is appreciated, but please don't add any more to it until we reduce the stock to a more manageable level.
