'Sea Falcon V'. Shown here on it's 'Does it float' test, this 60 inch wingspan model is pulled along by an Irvine 61. We await the flight test Malcolm!

During the meeting, Steve Mason mentioned that he had been contacted by the family of Brian Blizzard, a modeller who has recently passed away. Brian's model collection has been made available for sale, with proceeds going to the Club.
