This month's Spotlight Model is one that was passed on to me by Dave Wall when I turned up with a twin rotor autogyro last year (Thanks Dave). The model is a Durafly Auto G2 Gyrocopter. More commonly known as an autogyro in the UK, this

type of flying machine has been of interest to me since I used to see Ken Wallis flying around where I grew up. The model has a 33" rotor span, the motor and prop are stock and the battery is a 1300mAh, 3 cell LiPo. After my first flight I discovered that orientation was difficult, so repainted it. This has improved things somewhat but, with a few flights completed, it is still something to be wary of.
