With a massive 18" wingspan and a flying weight of 35gms (an ounce and a bit) I originally built this kit using the micro electronics recommended. However, this proved unsuccessful. usually slamming the model into a maximum rate roll, so the model was relegated to a high shelf and I bought a second hand E-flite UMXtra instead. After a few airframe repairs my luck remained unchanged and, on it's test flight, trimmed 'straight and level' involved a 30 degree bank to the right

and a 20 degree yaw to the left! The UMXtra has now ceased to exist (crunched up in the bin) and it's electronics have been transplanted to the M-Zone micro. The M-Zone now works, appears to have adequate power, and has tidier wiring. I now await a chance to test fly it. In the meantime my Clik 2 has been brought out of retirement.
