A few of us have already seen bits of this Month's Spotlight Model but it has not reduced the impression made when seeing it complete and painted. Thanks to Malcolm for sending in the details of his, almost complete, B17 'Flying Fortress'. This model is all 3D printed and although Malcolm

has done this previously with other models, they were not on this scale. With a wingspan of 7ft and powered by 4 x 3536 motors driving a brace of 8x6 3 bladed props, Malcolm is currently trying to obtain some stronger springs for the undercarriage. We all look forward to it's successful test flight but Malcolm ended his notes with " Not sure how long it will last as it feels a bit fragile and heavy".

The first Buckminster based RAFMAA Warbirds was deemed a reasonable success last weekend. Forty two aircraft were present on the Sunday and, hopefully, similar dates will made available at Buckminster in the future. The largest/heaviest model flown was an over 25kg Spitfire, and the smallest/lightest, was your scribe's very own RC combat Mustang at 265g.
