Built from 6mm Depron, either from a kit (off E-Bay) or a free plan download, the Polaris is a lightweight delta with modest power requirements. The Club Build was limited to a 2212/06 2200KV motor with a 3 cell battery. I

believe props up to 7x5 were used, although on mine, a 6x4 maxed out the motor's power rating of 15 Amps. (I tested a 7x5 and it was pulling 28 Amps on my average battery). To top the day out, Malcolm and Derek provided some bacon butties.
