As a Spotlight Model this month I thought I'd share with you my oldest surviving model, especially as I've been flying it a little more recently (but only when it's calm). This is my Ikarus Eco 8, built in 2001 and originally powered by an 8 cell NiCad and a brushed 500 size motor. Over the years this has been updated to a 3 cell 3900mAh



LiPo and a good brushless motor. With spares now being a bit difficult to find, I have bought two complete kits (one for only £10) to hopefully keep it flying for a few more years. The tail gyro is a basic one pinched out of a dead indoor micro heli and the rest of the electronics is similarly basic. The second picture was taken during Covid lockdown - just trying to maintain my sanity! After a bit more practise I may try a stall turn or pirouette but, at the moment, flying a normal circuit is challenging enough.

Flying in late January, in the background are the vehicles mentioned earlier. Big, yellow diggery things helping to fix the dyke. No, I don't know anything about big diggers!



Finally, don't forget about our 'Novelty Flying Machines' event, combined with a BBQ, and planned for May. If we're not including it with the FunFly (it would be a busy day), the 12th or 26th would be most likely, but the date will be decided at a Club meeting soon. The only rules are that the model cannot be multi-rotor based and must be able to fly a circuit and land within the Field.
