Our Spotlight Model this month is Derek's latest construction. It's a Corsair, built from a Flite Test free plan using the ever popular B&Q 6mm Extuded Polystyrene sheet. In this case the foam sheet was cold rolled to form the shape and, as Derek says, it was his hardest build yet. It also used more hot glue than he had ever used before. However, this and the blue packing tape used to cover it, helped keep the airframe

cost to about £4. This 46" span model runs on a 3541-1070kv motor and a 3 cell 2200mAh LiPo, giving about 6 minutes of flight time on it's 11x7 prop. The maiden flight was a little short and 'breaky' but, after repairs and some trimming out, it has proven to be a good flier.

After a little tree shaped mishap with the Club trainer, a replacement model has been aquired in the shape of an electric Seagull Models Boomerang. Initial testing has been carried out and, after putting the prop on the right way round, it was deemed suitable for the task.

Finally, we welcome Liam Martin as a new Club member. Although he has been here before, it was a few years ago, so welcome back Liam.
